## **Enrollment Packet**

Welcome Parents/Guardians and Students,

Thank you for choosing Salem Sayers Baptist Academy (SSBA) for your child's educational and spiritual needs.

- Completed enrollment packet (which includes immunization records, vision/hearing report, and Health Care Professional Statement (page 6) signed by doctor)
- Parent/Guardian ID's
- Student's official certified birth certificate
- Two years of report cards
- 7<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade students must also provide a letter of recommendation from their pastor and previous Christian school principal when applicable
- 3. Indicate the fee schedule of your choice and whether any childcare is needed (page 4).

Attached you will find enrollment papers, uniform dress code, a supply list, and other information. Please read over these carefully, complete each page fully, and return packet to the Academy office promptly. If you have any questions, concerns, comments, or praises, please contact the Academy office Monday through Friday during regular business hours (7:30 a.m.-4:00 p.m.) at (210) 649-1178.

Salem Sayers Baptist Academy reserves the right to expel, without prior notice, any student whose behavior endangers the other students or staff members, or whose behavior hampers the other students from learning. SSBA reserves the right to call unscheduled backpack, lunch box, purse, or desk checks to confiscate any illegal or improper items or substances. This may be done either individually or by the class.

## ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS **School Hours** 8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. Kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade Any student who leaves the school before or reports to school after 11:00 a.m. is considered absent for the day. More than six (6) absences per semester (unexcused) will result in the student being subject to failure of that semester. A parental conference will be required at this point. Extended illnesses or circumstances may be appealed to the Principal in writing before the end of the semester. **TARDINESS** Tardiness is very disruptive to the daily classroom routine. Therefore, three unexcused late arrivals will count as one unexcused absence, and added toward the total allotment per semester of six absences. Any arrival after 8:00 a.m. in the Elementary, Middle School, or High School will count toward this total. #### UNIFORM DRESS CODE K-8TH GRADE

Salem Sayers Baptist Academy has adopted a uniform dress code. This means every child is required to wear the same color and style of clothing. Students who are not dressed according to the dress code will be sent to the office and will be required to phone their parent/guardian for the appropriate dress.

Girls may wear no more than two traditional earrings on each ear lobe. Girls are asked to keep their jewelry modest and to a minimal amount. Hair should be a natural color. Hairstyles should not take away from the learning environment and the Academy reserves the right to make this determination.

Male students are to be clean-shaven (no beards and/or mustaches) and hair should be neatly groomed (i.e. hair should not touch the back shirt collar, hang below the ears, nor hang into the eyes.) Hair coloring should be a natural color. Boys are not allowed to wear any pierced jewelry. Students must be up to code when they arrive at school. This includes shirts tucked in at all times and the appropriate belts and shoes worn. Students are required to be in full uniform during school hours.

GIRLS BOYS

- Skirt: navy or khaki, knee-length
  - o no narrow pencil-type skirts permitted
  - o no skorts
- Jumper: navy or khaki, knee-length
- Dresses and shorts : not permitted
- Shorts <u>must</u> be worn under skirts & jumpers
- Pants: navy or khaki
  - o no cargo pants
  - o no capris
  - o no jeggings
- Belt: black or brown
- Polo Shirt: cardinal red, white, or navy blue (no logos)
- Turtlenecks/T-Shirts worn under polo shirt must be solid white, black, or navy
- Socks & tights: black, navy, or white
- Shoes: low top tennis shoes, dress/casual shoes with non-skid soles. Shoes must have straps.
  - No "heelies," boots of any kind, or open toe or backless shoes permitted at any time
- Sweaters/Jackets: solid colors, free of designs
- Jeans: must be free of rips, tears, slits, holes, and fraying. Solid blue, black and grey colored are permitted.
  - No capris, low-rise, hip-hugger, skinny jeans or jeggings.

- Pants: navy or khaki
- Walking Shorts: navy or khaki, knee-length
- Belt: black or brown
- Polo Shirt: cardinal red, white, or navy blue (no logos)
- Turtlenecks/T-Shirts worn under polo shirt must be solid white, black, or navy
- Shoes: low top tennis shoes, dress/casual shoes with non-skid soles
  - o No "heelies," or boots of any kind
- Socks: black, navy, or white
- Sweaters/Jackets: solid colors, free of designs
- Jeans: must be free of rips, tears, slits, holes, and fraying. Solid blue, black and grey colored are permitted.
  - No low-rise, hip-hugger, or skinny jeans
  - No jean shorts

The Academy reserves the right to make the determinations as to whether or not clothing is "modest" and "acceptable."

<u>Casual Friday</u>: Every Friday, students may wear jeans (see dress code above) and a Christian t-shirt, their school-issued T-shirt or their red, white or navy blue school polo shirt.
